



**FAIR TRIAL INITIATIVE
2011-2013 OSBORN LAW FELLOWSHIP
APPLICATION**

The Fair Trial Initiative is looking for outstanding third-year law students and lawyers who are committed to providing first-rate legal representation to indigent defendants facing the death penalty. The Osborn Fellowship selection process is very competitive, special consideration will be given to applicants with a demonstrated interest in capital and criminal defense work, as well as those who articulate a desire to continue practice in North Carolina upon completion of the fellowship.

Description of the Fellowship

The Fair Trial Osborn Fellowship requires a two-year commitment to run from September 2011 to August 2013. Fellows should be prepared to begin work after Labor Day. Compensation is \$34,000 per year plus benefits and extensive training. While it is in the nature of trial work that some periods will be extremely demanding, we envision that, on average, fellows will work 40 hour weeks. Fellows are expected to have a reliable vehicle throughout the fellowship, and extensive travel can be expected, both in the course of representing clients and for training.

Eligibility

Osborn Fellows must be graduates of an accredited law school by the time the fellowship begins. Fellowship applicants should be planning to take the North Carolina bar in the summer preceding their fellowship if they are not already licensed lawyers.

Applicants need not be current law students to be considered for a fellowship. We welcome applicants with clerkship or other practical experience.

To apply for the fellowship, please send:

1. Your resume accompanied by a cover letter articulating your interest in capital defense work.
2. A copy of your law school transcript.
3. The completed Osborn Fellow Application Cover Sheet that can be downloaded from our website (www.fairtrial.org)
4. A writing sample of not more than 10 pages.
5. The names and phone numbers of the following references:
 - a. One supervisor from every legal job you have had since starting law school (including clinics and externship programs). Please include the name of the employing agency or program as well as that of the supervisor.
 - b. One law school professor who is familiar with your academic performance.
6. FTI is pleased to receive any additional material which would assist us in evaluating your application.

BY October 31, 2010.**

No application will be considered which is received after October 31, 2010. We will contact finalists to arrange interviews.
